We hope to celebrate this special milestone surrounding the theme "Back to the Future: Forging Future Horizons through History," highlighting the changes over the past 50 years, showcasing our successes and examining our challenges. We will also continue to identify the best practices and most promising scientific advancements that will allow us to face future challenges, making this year's meeting a very special commemorative occasion. 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SCHOLARSHIP & AWARDS COMMITTEE

New for 2023, the award amounts were doubled to \$1,000 per winner - thanks to the generosity of the Camaione Student Endowment! Grant winners will receive their award in June 2023 and be recognized at the NEACSM Annual Fall Meeting in October 2023.

University faculty are asked to encourage qualifying students to apply for these scholarships.

Back to NEACSM's Presidential Future

It is with great excitement that I can share with our members the 50th anniversary of NEACSM! In the fall of 1973, NEACSM held its first official Annual Meeting at Springfield College, where NEACSM's soon-to-be second President Howard H. Hartley delivered a lecture titled "Essentials of Clinical Exercise Testing," which was followed up by afternoon presentations by Drs. Whitney R. Powers, C. David Ianuzzo, Roger G. Soule (NEACSM's 3rd President), Robert B. Armstrong, and Howard G. Knuttgen. Knuttgen would go on to become ACSM President and be honored through the naming of the Knuttgen Keynote Lecture, held at all fall NEACSM conferences. The first recorded meeting of exercise physiologists in New England also occurred in Springfield in 1962, where ACSM Past Presidents Drs. Joseph B. Wolffe, Albert S. Hyman, Peter V. Karpovich,

Ellsworth R. Buskirk, and Charles M. Tipton would deliver talks. How great it will be to have our 50th anniversary of NEACSM this year, and furthermore have ACSM Past President Dr. NiCole Keith join us to deliver a keynote lecture named after another ACSM and NEACSM Past President, Dr. Priscilla Clarkson! Current ACSM President-Elect, Dr. Irene Davis, will also be at the conference, delivering the Knuttgen Keynote Lecture. We hope that you will also be able to join us as we get back to our future of NEACSM in Springfield, MA!
