I am pleased to announce our first ever virtual spring meeting, entitled "Managing Physical Activity in the New Normal: Science to Practice." This one-day synchronous event is scheduled for Friday, April 23, 2021 and will be hosted through Zoom webinar. The meeting format is designed to enhance attendee interaction during four themed sessions. Each session will focus on a different topic associated with the negative effects of physical inactivity on health and how they relate to a rapidly changing work, research, and learning environment. A series of several ten-minute presentations from a diverse group of subject matter experts will occur at the beginning of each session, followed by a highly interactive discussion. The discussion will expand on lecture topics and afford attendees real time participation by submitting questions to the presenters. All evidence-based program content will provide the Exercise Professional and student with best methods to combat physical inactivity, conduct physical activity research, and develop virtual programming during the pandemic era and beyond. There will also be a student highlight session focusing on how to navigate research and education with associated challenges and barriers imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic. We intend to return to in-person programming in Providence, Rhode Island on October 21 and 22, 2021 to underscore impressive advancements in our respective fields to leave us informed, intrigued, and inspired. Accordingly, the Executive Committee, Program Planning Committee and I present to you an overview of the Fall 2021 meeting, titled "Progress in Motion."

We are thrilled to report that our Knuttgen and Clarkson Keynote lecture invitations have been accepted. Dr. Neil Walsh, Professor of Sport and Exercise Science at Liverpool John Moores University will deliver the Knuttgen lecture highlighting relationships amongst exercise, nutrition, and immune health. Dr. Monica Hubal, Associate Professor of Kinesiology at Indiana University - Purdue University Indianapolis and former student of the late Dr. Priscilla Clarkson will deliver the Clarkson Keynote lecture. Dr. Hubal will present her work on exercise-related molecular pathway models. The Past President's Lecture will be presented by **Dr. Dain LaRoche** who will share his work with socially assistive robots. Additional topics will include the influence of exercise on gut microbes and intestinal health (Dr. Sara Campbell from Rutgers University), the utility of machine learning in exercise and health sciences (Dr. Michael **Bergeron** from SIVOTEC Analytics), narrative and active video gaming to promote physical activity (Dr. Amy Lu form Northeastern University), and much more!

FREE COMMUNICATION UPDATE

We had a successful virtual Fall 2020 Conference with 39 abstract submissions.

Fall 2020 saw the introduction of the Professional category, which attracted eight submissions. Separately, we received 31 student investigator abstract submissions, with 17 in the non-competition category and 14 in the competition category. Under the competition category, there were five Bachelor's, seven Master's, and three Doctoral entries. The winning Doctoral entry was selected to represent NEACSM at the ACSM President's Cup competition. Virtual presentations were in PowerPoint format with embedded audio, posted on the conference platform as videos.

The current balance of the CSE investment account totals over \$296,000 (1/31/21). The number of donations year to year is quite small, with annual member contributions ranging between three to four thousand dollars. The CSE will provide our top performing students with over \$10,000 in supportive funding this year.

The CSE continues to need everyone's support to grow this fund in order for more dollars to be given out to students, and every dollar helps. The fund uses the interest and dividends earned each year to fund the above-listed student initiatives. To be able to increase the monetary awards given each year by \$1,000, we must bring in about \$25,000.00 of new donations. The CSE challenges all members of the New England Chapter to contribute to this fund at any dollar level.

Just over 55 years ago, ACSM held its first regional meeting in New England at UMASS Amherst.

Howard "Skip" Knuttgen, ACSM's President in 1974, whose name graces one of our Chapter Keynote lectures, is now in his 60th year of ACSM membership. Dr. Knuttgen studied under a founding member of ACSM, Dr. Peter Karpovich, and he went to school at Springfield College with Charlie Tipton, who also went on to become a President of ACSM. Dr. Knuttgen actually holds membership number 279 from our national organization! I was fortunate enough to recently catch up with Dr. Knuttgen via a Zoom

meeting. This one-day meeting had eight current, past, or future presidents of the organization: many of whom can be seen in this picture (fun fact: the photo was taken on a treadmill!). It seems hard to believe, but Dr. Knuttgen's
